### WAC 220-330-04000M Crab--Areas and Seasons—Personal use.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-330-040, effective immediately through December 31, 2023, it is unlawful to fish for crab for personal use in Puget Sound in all waters of Marine Areas, 4 east of the Bonilla-Tatoosh line, 5, 6, 7, 8-1, 8-2, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13, except as provided herein:

- (1) Marine areas 4 east of the Bonilla-Tatoosh line, 5, 6, 8-1, 8-2, and 9: Effective 12:01 a.m. October 1, through 11:59 p.m. December 31, 2023, it is permissible to fish for crab for personal use seven days a week.
- Those waters of Marine Area 7 south and west of a line projected from Village Point, Lummi Island, through the navigation buoy just east of Matia Island, thence to the buoy at Clements Reef, thence to the easternmost point of Patos Island, thence running along the northern shore of Patos Island to the westernmost point of Patos Island, thence true west to the international boundary and south of a line that extends from Point Francis on Portage Island, through the marker just north of Inati Bay on Lummi Island to Lummi Island: Effective 12:01 a.m. October 1, 2023, through 11:59 p.m. December 31, 2023, it is permissible to fish for crab for personal use seven days a week.
- (3) Those waters of Marine Area 7 north and east of a line projected from Village Point, Lummi Island through the navigation buoy just east of Matia Island thence to the buoy at Clements Reef thence to the easternmost point of Patos Island, running along the northern shoreline of Patos Island and from the westernmost point of Patos Island true west to the international boundary and north of a line that extends from Point Francis on Portage Island, through the marker just north of Inati Bay on Lummi Island to Lummi Island: Effective 12:01 a.m. October 1, 2023, through 11:59 p.m. December 31, 2023, it is permissible to fish for crab for personal use seven days a week.
- (4) The portion of Marine Area 12 north of a line projected due east from Ayock Point: Effective October 1, 2023, through 11:59 p.m. December 31, 2023, it is permissible to fish for crab for personal use seven days a week.
- (5) Marine Area 10: Closed until further notice.
- (6) Marine Area 11: Closed until further notice.
- (7) The portion of Marine Area 12 south of a line projected due east from Ayock Point: Closed until further notice.
- (8) Marine Area 13: Closed until further notice.
