WAC 220-330-16000R Razor clams - Areas and Seasons.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-330-160, it is unlawful to take, dig for or possess razor clams taken for personal use from any beaches in any razor clam area except as provided for in this section:

(1) Effective 12:01 a.m. April 23 through 11:59 a.m. April 29, 2024, razor clam digging is permissible in Razor Clam Areas defined in WAC 220-330-160 on dates and times listed below:

Area 1	April 24 through April 29	From 12:01 a.m. to 11:59 a.m.
Area 2	Closed	Closed
Area 3	April 25 through April 28	From 12:01 a.m. to 11:59 a.m.
Area 4	April 23, 26, and 27	From 12:01 a.m. to 11:59 a.m.
Area 5	April 24, 25, 28 and 29	From 12:01 a.m. to 11:59 a.m.
Area 6	Closed	Closed
Area 7	Closed	Closed

(2) It is unlawful to dig for razor clams at any time in the Long Beach and Copalis Beach Clam sanctuaries defined in WAC 220-320-130.
