WAC 220-330-16000Z Razor clams - Areas and Seasons.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-330-160, it is unlawful to take, dig for or possess razor clams taken for personal use from any beaches in any razor clam area except as provided for in this section:

(1) Effective December 28, 2024, through January 3, 2025, razor clam digging is permissible in Razor Clam Areas defined in WAC 220-330-160 on dates and times listed below:
