NEW SECTION

WAC 220-313-06000K Puget Sound salmon—saltwater seasons and daily limits.

Effective April 9 through April 30, 2025, salmon rules for Catch Record Card areas 5, 10 and 11 shall be modified as described in this section. All other provisions of WAC 220-313-060 not addressed in this section, or unless otherwise amended by emergency rule, remain in effect:

- (1) Catch Record Card Area 5: Salmon;
 - (a) Immediately, through April 13: Closed.
 - (b) April 14 through April 30: Daily limit 1. Release all salmon other than hatchery Chinook.
- (2) Catch Record Card Area 10, except year-round piers (Seacrest Pier, Waterman Pier, Bremerton Boardwalk, and Illahee State Park Pier): Salmon;

April 9 through April 30: Closed.

(3) Catch Record Card Area 11, except year-round piers (Des Moines Pier, Les Davis Pier, and Point Defiance Boathouse Dock): Salmon;

Immediately, through April 30:

- (a) Open Wednesday through Saturday only, each week; daily limit 2 including no more than 1 hatchery Chinook. Release wild Chinook and chum. Closed Sunday through Tuesday, each week.
- (b) Commencement Bay (east of a line from Cliff House Restaurant to Sperry Ocean Dock): Closed to fishing for or retention of salmon.

REPEALER

The following section of Washington Administrative Code is repealed, effective April 9, 2025:

WAC 220-313-06000J Puget Sound salmon—saltwater seasons and daily limits. (25-23)
