expires on May 15, 2025. Federal Endangered Species Act (ESA) consultations on 2025-26 Puget Sound salmon fisheries						
are ongoing but are unlikely to be completed by May 15th. Marine Area 13 salmon fisheries are known to intercept ESA-						
listed Chinook in the May period. Accordingly, Marine Area 13 will temporarily close for salmon fishing starting May 15, 2025.						
Salmon fisheries will resume when ESA authorization is received for the proposed 2025-26 Puget Sound salmon fishing package.
