WAC 220-312-03000F Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Southwest.

Effective immediately, until further notice, the provisions of WAC 220-312-030 regarding Klickitat River and Lewis River salmon seasons shall be modified during times and as described in this section. All other provisions of WAC 220-312-030 not addressed in this section remain in effect unless otherwise amended by emergency rule:

(1) Klickitat River (Klickitat Co.):

(a) From the mouth (BNSF Railroad Bridge) to Fisher Hill Bridge:

Effective immediately, until further notice: Salmon closed.

(b) From 400 feet upstream from #5 fishway to boundary markers below Klickitat Salmon hatchery:

Effective immediately, until further notice: Salmon closed.

(2) Lewis River (Clark/Cowlitz Co.); from the mouth to Colvin Creek:

Effective June 6 through July 31, 2025: Salmon daily limit 6 including no more than 1 adult. Release all salmon other than hatchery Chinook.
