NEW SECTION

WAC 220-313-06000P Puget Sound salmon—saltwater seasons and daily limits.

Effective June 15 through September 1, 2025, salmon rules for Catch Record Card Area 8-2 Tulalip Terminal Area shall be modified as described in this section. All other provisions of WAC 220-313-060 not addressed in this section, or unless otherwise amended by emergency rule, remain in effect:

(1) Catch Record Card Area 8-2; the Tulalip Terminal Area:

- (a) Tulalip Terminal Area is defined as: Waters west of Tulalip Bay and within 2,000 feet of shore from the pilings at Old Bower's Resort to a fishing boundary marker approximately 1.4 miles northwest of Hermosa Point and not including waters east of a line drawn from Mission Point to Hermosa Point.
- (b) Salmon: Effective June 15 through September 1, 2025:
 - (i) Open from 12:01 a.m. Friday through 11:59 p.m. Saturday each week;
 - (ii) Fishery is closed on Saturday June 21, 2025.
 - (iii) Daily limit 2. Release chum and pink.

REPEALER
