NEW SECTION

WAC 220-305-085 Closed areas—WSDOT ferry terminals. (1) It is unlawful for any vessel to engage in any recreational crabbing or shrimping or commercial crabbing, shrimping, gillnetting or purse seine fishing within a rectangular-shaped closure area that extends 100 yards to either side of each end of any Washington state-managed ferry terminal and extending 400 yards in a straight line into the water from the end of each terminal.

Except for the Coupeville ferry terminal whose closure area shall extend 800 yards in a straight line into the water from the end of the terminal.

- (2) In addition to the definition of a "terminal" in RCW 79.105.060(21) and for the purpose of this rule, the end of the terminal is the point of interchange where the ferry docks to load and unload passengers.
- (3) It is unlawful for vessel operators engaged in fishing to violate the provisions of 33 C.F.R. Section 165.1301.
- (4) For recreational fishers, a violation of this section is an infraction punishable under RCW 77.15.160. For commercial fishers, a violation of this section is a gross misdemeanor under RCW 77.15.550.
