FRANCIS V. ESTALILLA, M.D. Eye Physician and Surgeon

My name is Francis Estalilla, retired ophthalmologist and avid outdoorsman in Grays Harbor County for the past 31 years.

I wish to draw your attention to a major oversight in the agency's mission to promote INCLUSION, particularly regarding those individuals with medical/surgical disabilities.

The law currently makes provisions for harvesters (fisher and/or hunter) with a PERMANENT disability to participate in recreational harvest of game, fish and shellfish.

The oversight in the rule is the very EXCLUSIONARY policy of denying these same provisions to harvesters with time-limited disabilities. I am specifically referring to persons with medical or surgical conditions that would preclude their ability to harvest game, fish, and shellfish without assistance. Examples would include a stroke patient that might require a 2-year rehabilitation to become ablebodied again, a patient with orthopedic trauma that would require 12-18 months of physical therapy and rehab to regain full function to engage in activities afield, or a patient with an infected non-healing wound that may take 6 months or more to close with special treatment.

I have found myself on both sides of this equation. Since 2018, I have served as "designated digger" for an elderly friend, digging all his razor clams for the past 7 seasons. Last June I suffered a major orthopedic trauma (left tibial plateau fracture requiring an 11 hour surgery. Thankfully I was healed up enough in time to participate in the fall/winter clam digging season beginning in October 2024. I was able to successfully dig not only my limit each outing, but also that of my permanently disabled friend. All was well until the last week of January 2025 when I developed a postoperative infection that was melting my surgical wound. I am now sentenced to at least 3 months of antibiotics and NON weight bearing on my injured/infected leg. This effectively puts me out of commission for the remainder of the winter/spring razor clam season.

I find it troubling that anyone in my position afflicted with a medical and/or surgical condition would be denied harvesting privileges simply because that disabling condition is "time limited". The state routinely issues "time limited" handicap parking placards for temporary disabilities. It stands to reason that WDFW should do likewise to accommodate harvesters with a disability, especially in these times where promoting INCLUSIVITY is of paramount concern across all state agencies.

"Temporary" disabilities of say 6, 12, 18, or 24 months are no small matter...especially for lifetime outdoorsmen. Missing the rest of this spring clam season and perhaps the beginning of the next fall season is a devastating blow, esp when considered within the context of the many other life-changing issues that my injury has already presented.

I seek your assistance in righting this EXCLUSIONARY oversight once and for all. Even if it does not result in any direct benefit to me within the time it takes to get it passed, I believe it is an important issue for hundreds, perhaps thousands of disabled Washingtonians.

Any help you can provide to facilitate this rule-making effort and bring it to the attention of the Fish and Wildlife Commission would be greatly appreciated.
