## THE FOLLOWING SEASONS WERE SET:

<i>2014 Treaty Spring Gillnet Commercial Fishery</i>	
Area:	SMCRA 1F, 1G, 1H (Zone 6 Bonneville Dam upstream to McNary Dam)
Season:	6:00 a.m. June 3 until 6:00 p.m. June 6, 2014
Allowable Sales:	Salmon, steelhead, shad, walleye, carp, catfish, bass, and yellow perch may be sold or kept for subsistence. Sturgeon between 43-54 inches fork length harvested in The Dalles or John Day Pools and sturgeon between 38-54 inches fork length in the Bonneville pool may not be sold but may be kept for subsistence.
Gear:	Gill nets. No mesh restriction
Sanctuaries:	Standard dam and river mouth sanctuaries in effect for this gear type except for the Spring Creek Hatchery sanctuary which is not necessary this time of year.
Miscellaneous:	<p><u>24-hour quick reporting</u> required for Washington wholesale dealers, pursuant to WAC 220-69-240, <b>except</b> landings must be reported within 24-hours of completing the fish ticket. The intent is that all landings in areas 1F, 1G and 1H must be quick reported within 24 hours of completion.</p> <p>Submission of a report is not complete until the report arrives at the designated department location.</p> <p><b>Reports can be made via fax at 360-906-6776 or 360-906-6777; via e-mail at <a href="mailto:crfishtickets@dfw.wa.gov">crfishtickets@dfw.wa.gov</a>; or via phone at 1- 866-791-1281.</b></p> <p>Faxing or reporting electronically in portable document format (PDF) a copy of each fish receiving ticket used, within the previously indicated time frames specified per area, satisfies the quick reporting requirement.</p>

### *Quick Reporting Rule – Mainstem Platform Hook & Line and Tributary*

For all treaty Columbia River mainstem platform hook and line and tributary fisheries

Effective 6 a.m. June 3 until further notice:

The 24-hour quick reporting is required for Washington wholesale dealers, pursuant to WAC 220-69-240, **except** landings must be reported within 24-hours of completing the fish ticket.

The intent is that all landings in areas 1E, 1F, 1G and 1H and the tributaries must be quick reported within 24 hours of completion
