DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE (DNS)

Name of Proposal: GEORGE ADAMS HATCHERY POLLUTION ABATEMENT POND

Description of Proposal:

Project includes construction of a pollution abatement system at the WDFW George Adams Hatchery to treat the waste flow that is generated from cleaning fish rearing ponds. This untreated waste is currently discharged into wetland areas adjacent to the hatchery. The pollution abatement system will be built in the same footprint as the three existing keeper ponds, which are scheduled for demolition. The specific components of this project are:

- 1. Remove three 14-foot wide by 120-foot long keeper channel raceways.
- 2. Install two settling basins and overflow/decant tanks in the same footprint.
- 3. Install portable waste pump connections.
- 4. Construct a new discharge location for clarified water.
- 5. Abandon existing wastewater discharge locations.

The site address is 40 West Skokomish Valley Road, Shelton, Washington 98584. The project site is in Mason County, Section 12, Township 22 North, Range 4 West. The parcel number is 422125003001.
