### DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE (DNS)

**Name of Proposal:** BURK DRAINAGE REPAIR

**Description of Proposal:** Repair drainage due to December flood of 2007. Flood waters created a broad channel migration zone through the forested wetland area in the northerly ½ of lot. Proposal is to excavate the sediment that built up after the storm and build a berm to encourage the stream to return to its original channel. There appears to be remnants of a channel outlet into the lake close to the NE lot corner and one directly north of the channel, water is sheet flowing across the forest and taking trees along the way.
