## Hello Sonia,

During construction of the Langsdorf Boat Ramp Access Renovation project, Washington State Fish and Wildlife will comply with all best management practices to protect water quality. All required permits will be applied for. We anticipate receipt of a USACE Nationwide Permit that will include the 401 water quality certification. If the certification is not included, it will be applied for separately. In addition, all applicable major Development permits from Clark County, and an HPA will be applied

• Proper disposal of construction debris will be done by taking debris to an approved permitted disposal facility or recycling facility.

- Erosion control measures will be strictly adhered to, including all BMPS related to sediment laden runoff or other pollutants.
- Cleanup of spills will take first priority. If any spills occur, they will be contained and removed in a manner that will prevent their discharge to waters and soils of the state.
- Trenches depressions or holes created in the intertidal area will be backfilled prior to inundation by tidal waters.
- Stormwater discharges will be constructed in a manner that will use best management practices, and not cause scouring on the beach.
- All erosion control measures will be in place prior to any clearing, grading or construction.
- No uncured concrete will be used as a component of this project.
