DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE (DNS)

Name of Proposal: DNS 16-025: SCOTCH CREEK WILDLIFE AREA CULVERT

REMOVAL

Description of Proposal:

- An old culvert has failed causing soil washout at an earthen filled crossing of Scotch Creek. We would like to remove the earth fill, and old culvert and replace with a wooden foot bridge. The culvert and creek crossing is a small area of 13 feet long by 10 feet wide at the headquarters of the Scotch Creek Wildlife Area.
- We propose to excavate the earthen fill and old culvert with a standard backhoe. Slope the banks 2:1 and seed the disturbed soil with native grass. We estimate removing a total of 5 cubic yards of soil.
- Two 6' ecology blocks will be places as bridge abutments on either side of the creek and a 15' x 6' wooden bridge deck placed over the creek.
- We have the ability to divert the creek through a previous pipeline put in by WDFW to bypass the project area. The construction site will be completely de-watered before any soil disturbance occurs, thus protecting fish life and preventing any sedimentation.
