RE: DNS 18-066: Dewald Waterway Cleanout

Dear Lisa Wood:

We have received a Determination of Nonsignificance (DNS), SEPA Checklist, and associated documents pertaining to the Dewald Waterway Cleanout Project in Davenport, Lincoln County, Washington, for our review and comment. Please be advised that your proposed undertaking lies within the traditional territories of the Sanpoil Tribe, one of the twelve constituent tribes of the Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation (Colville Confederated Tribes [CCT]), which is governed by the Colville Business Council (CBC). The CBC has delegated to the Tribal Historic Preservation Officer (THPO) the responsibility of representing the CCT with regard to cultural resources management issues throughout the traditional territories of all of the constituent tribes under Resolution 1996-29. This area includes parts of eastern Washington, northeastern Oregon, the Palus (Palouse) territory in Idaho, and south central British Columbia.

The CCT has not yet been consulted regarding the potential effects of this undertaking on cultural resources. We request that a formal consultation letter be sent to our office that provides a description of the project and clearly depicts the proposed Area of Potential Effects (APE) including staging and stockpiling areas. We would ordinarily request that a cultural resources survey, inclusive of subsurface testing a consideration of Traditional Cultural Properties (TCPs), be undertaken in relation to this undertaking and that a draft of the resultant report be submitted to our office for review and concurrence. However, we concur with the recommendation of the Spokane Tribe of Indians, as articulated within the SEPA checklist, that all ground disturbance associated with the project be monitored by a Secretary of the Interior qualified archaeologist
